Do you know your rights?

I've been arrested, will my parents find out?

Yes. The police have to notify your parents/guardians if you once you are arrested.

The police want to question me, do I have to answer their questions?

If police ask for your name, age and address it is a good idea to give them this information. If they want to ask you other questions, you have the right not to answer. If you do not want to answer, be polite and say that you do not wish to answer. If you are under arrest, ask to speak to a lawyer or your parents before you answer any questions.

I have a youth record, who can see it?

There are very few people who will have access to the information in your youth record including, police, courts, your lawyer, your parents and yourself. The general public does not have access to your record.

I need advice, can I talk to a lawyer?

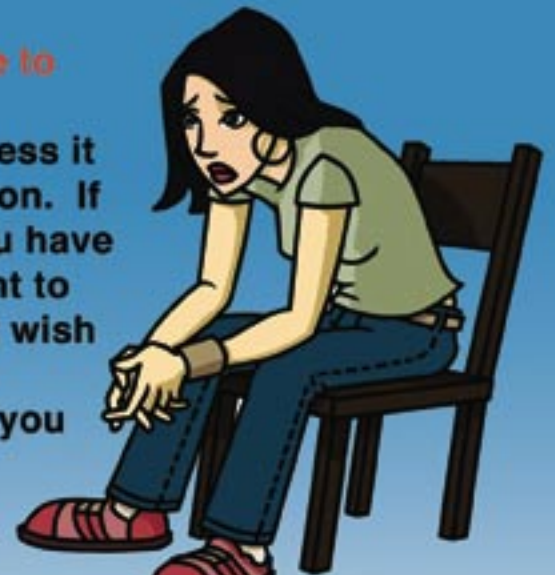
You have the right to speak with a lawyer right away if you have been arrested or are being questioned by the police. The police must give you the time and privacy to speak to a lawyer. You also have the right to have your parents, guardian or another adult with you. If you have to go to court you may be able to get help paying for a lawyer.

Can I get a job if I have an open youth record?

Having a youth record does not mean you cannot get a job. It may make it more difficult and may affect the type of job you are able to get.

If I have to spend time in custody (jail), will I have to serve my time with adults in an adult jail?

No. Youth are kept separate from adults in custody. Most youth in custody will spend time in a special youth correctional facility. However, if a separate facility is not available or would not be appropriate you may spend time in an adult facility but be kept separate from the adults.
