<p>Family Mediation Family mediators can help people settle issues about parenting, separation, and divorce. There is a fee for mediation to which both parties usually contribute. <p>Family Legal Aid This is a service of the New Brunswick Legal Aid Services Commission. It helps low income individuals deal with certain family law matters. Gives priority to screening those cases that are urgent or can directly benefit children.
